

VOLUNTEERISM



How effective is the Reading/Bicycle Program at Lowell School?

The following is an interview with Mr. Kelly, Principal at Lowell School:

The American Legion Post 41 and the Sons of the American Legion have helped the schools climate, culture, and reading scores with the implementation of Reading, Bicycle program at Lowell, students that were showing significant improvement in reading in grades second through six were awarded a bicycle for their efforts. Those bikes were awarded to students at all school assemblies to celebrate their hard work and success.

When looking at the multiple measure (Galileo Assessments, AIMS web Assessments and classroom formative assessments) Lowell make achievements when moving students up from the Falls Far Below category to approaches on higher. This resulted in the school receiving three additional points on the letter grade matrix used by the Arizona Department of Education. The bicycle program helped to improve the lower the students to strive to

be better readers as the program did not focus on the high students, but the most improved. Post 41's and the Sons of the American Legion continued support of this program continues to give all students, on extra incentives to work harder in their studies.

The Bicycle/Reading program is truly making a difference in children's lives.

"Thunderbird" post. Tony was our first Post 41 Service Officer. During conflict in WWII, fighting in the Philippines, Tony distinguished himself by continuing to hold a machine gun position for 17 hours. For his wounds, he was awarded the Purple Heart and the Bronze Star. Most recently, the Post is now named Tony Soza-Ray Martinez Post 41, as rechartered at the Dept. Convention, 2003.

spearheaded the following projects for the club to carry out.

- Fixing the leaks above the Ronda Room bar.
- Replacing and plastering damaged sections of the ceiling.
- Repairing the inoperable ice machine by installing a new motor and switch, which was donated by member Sonny Gonzalez.
- Several members remodeled the kitchen to include a stainless steel exhaust hood and a backsplash kitchen sink, which Post 41 member Dr. Loui Olivas was instrumental in acquiring the funds necessary for this project from the AZ Diamondback organization.

Q. How is the Am Legion Cap to be worn during certain ceremonies?

At church services, the cap is removed going into the church as a group, and during the service. The cap is worn by Honor Guards and commander or while standing guard, uncovering when return to the pews. It can then be worn upon exiting the church. The cap is removed during chaplain prayer or on command by the commander or chaplain. Remember, no

Q. When do we salute the US Flag?

A. As veterans, we have the authority (change to Section 9 of the US Flag Code) to salute the flag whether or not we are in uniform or wearing identifying veteran apparel such as an Am Legion cap. The salute is rendered anytime there is a hoisting or lowering of the US Flag, or whenever it passes. All others present should remove any headwear, face the flag and place their right hand over their heart; citizens of foreign countries should stand at attention.

Q. What is the significance of the 21 gun salute?

A. The 21 gun salute stands for the sum of the numbers in the year 1776, the year of our country's Independence.
